


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


Just Transition Framework



Implementing JT Framework

- Engagement with National Planning Commission, DPME and NT around integration into NDP, MTSF and budget
- Recommendations on future energy mix, market structure and energy sector governance (see later)
- Detailed planning around employment and skills development for future labour force
- Collaboration with GreenCape and TIPS around green economy agency and economic diversification for Mpumalanga
- Detailed exploration of Komati decommissioning project and integration with economic diversification strategy
- Design of just transition financing mechanism and engagement with DFIs and PCFTT



Other work that is ongoing

- Development of methodology and case studies for climate resilient development pathways
- Development of costing methodology for loss & damage and climate adaptation measures
- Detailed modelling to inform decision making on pace of decommissioning coal fired power stations
- Report on feasible net-zero pathways and the development of a time bound target
- ► Tracking climate finance flows
- ► Annual M&E report on State of Climate Action in SA



Governance

- First annual report presented for adoption by Commission
- Charter approved by Cabinet, can now be adopted
- Input on Climate Change Bill to be considered at this meeting

PCC Finances

- NT approval obtained for remuneration of Commissioners, quarterly remuneration should now work smoothly
- Business plan amended after strategic planning session, & approved by Finance & Governance Committee
- Fundraising strategy adopted
- Continued reliance on donor funds to fund core costs and staff, while there is underspending of DFFE funds
- ► First private sector sponsorship from Vodacom for multistakeholder conference
- Substantial multi-year programme of support under discussion with Global Energy Alliance for People and Planet
